DISTRICT ITEMS:

2013-2104 DISTRICT GOALS -ONGOING

- 1. To implement the first phase of personalized learning via the utilization of technological resources which will identify a student's individual learning needs, engage the student in academic goal setting, and provide content, practice and immediate feedback.
- 2. To explore the feasibility of offering online/blended High School elective courses in order to develop competence and confidence in a virtual learning environment.
- To further develop and implement comprehensive curricula in the areas of English Language
 Arts and Mathematics which are fully aligned to the New York State Common Core Learning
 Standards.
- 4. In the second year of Annual Professional Performance Review (APPR) implementation, teachers will revise and refine local measures in order to ensure rigorous, comparable and responsible assessment practices.
- 5. To ensure compliance with the federal "Affordable Care Act" with regard to legal requirements and appropriate financial planning.
- 6. To write, review and/or revise District policies to ensure compliance with the recently enacted legislation and related regulations by the New York State Department of Education, including but not limited to: Annual Professional Performance Review, New York State Assessments, and the New York State Common Core Learning Standards.

TEACHER CONTRACT-6/30/12-ONGOING

Teachers are in their second year without a contract. Mediation is taking place but there is no progress to report.

SCHOOL SECURITY: ONGOING:

- 1. Major upgrades are taking place this summer.
- 2. More high resolution cameras are being installed.
- 3. 96 sets of doors at CSHHS will have alarms on doors.
- 4. A renovation of LHS entry will take place. The main office and nurse's office will be moved to create a better visual of building for main office.
- 5. A new alert system is being adopted so top administrators will be contacted immediately of any issues.
- 6. LHS and WSS are participating in the CAPS program for internet safety.

OTHER DISTRICT ITEMS:

- 2. Common Core issue is still unsettled. Issue with Pearson not releasing test questions is still unresolved.
- 3. Annual budget vote is coming up on Tuesday, May 20.

PARENT ITEMS:

1. Parents have addressed the BOE regarding creating a new position or hiring another social worker for drug, alcohol and mental health intervention. Dr. Wilansky will be making a recommendation for an effective mental health model to address substance abuse. She will discuss it at the Parent Leaders Brunch on April 25.
